

EDWARD JENNER

Inventor of the vaccination

1749

Born on May 17 in Berkeley, Gloucestershire, England.

1763

Apprentices to local surgeon Daniel Ludlow at the age of 14.

1773

Completes medical training at St. George's Hospital, London.

1772

Returns to Berkeley as local medical practitioner and surgeon.

1783

Develops method for purifying tartar emetic, a chemical used to treat parasitic diseases.

1789

For a scientific paper explaining the nesting habits of the cuckoo bird, elected fellow of the Royal Society.

1796

Successfully vaccinates eight-year-old James Phipps, protecting him from smallpox, with inoculation prepared from cowpox disease.

1798

Publishes "An Inquiry into the Causes and Effects of the Variolae Vaccinae," in which he describes the use of cowpox inoculation to prevent smallpox.

1804

Awarded special medal by Napoleon, honoring his medical achievement.

1809

For his knowledge of geology, earth science, and fossilization, elected member of the Geologic Society.

1010

Discovers the fossilized remains of what we now call a plesiosaur.

1823

Dies on January 26 in Berkeley, England.
